The 2001 United Nations Special Session on HIV/AIDS (UNGASS) adopted the Declaration of Commitment on HIV/AIDS – a clear statement recognising the AIDS pandemic as a global emergency, challenging life and dignity, human rights and economic development. By signing the Declaration countries agreed to time-bound commitments and a regular process to review their progress in meeting those commitments. UNGASS refers to the process of regularly reviewing the progress signatories of the Declaration have made in honouring their agreement. A number of years have past since the Declaration was signed. As AIDS campaigners we have to keep the memory of the UNGASS promises and the enthusiasm to achieve them as alive as if those commitments were made yesterday.
